OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Amendment in Para 8.1 and Para 8.2 of deputation guidelines issued vide OM No.6/8/2009-Estt.Pay-II dated 17th June,2010-regarding.

This Department's OM No.6/8/2009-Estt.(Pay-II) dated 17th June 2010 regulates pay, Deputation (Duty) Allowance, Tenure of Deputation/Foreign Service and other terms and conditions on the subject of deputation/foreign service of Central Government employees. This Department's OM No.2/6/2016-Estt.Pay-II dated 17th February,2016 further delegated powers to Ministries/Departments/ borrowing organization to extend deputation tenures up to a period not exceeding 7 years at a stretch, in respect of cases covered by OM dated 17th June,2010.

- 2. It has now been decided to amend the provisions relating to Tenure of deputation/foreign service and level of approval for the same as mentioned in Para 8.1 and Para 8.2 of Department's OM No.6/8/2009-Estt.(Pay-II) dated 17th June, 2010. Para 8.1 and 8.2 of the OM No.6/8/2009-Estt.(Pay-II) dated 17.06.2010 are modified as under:-
- 8.1- The period of deputation/ foreign service shall be as per the Recruitment Rules of the ex-cadre post or 5 years in case no tenure regulations exist for the ex-cadre post.
- 8.2 In case where the period of deputation/foreign service prescribed in the recruitment rules of the ex-cadre post is 5 years or less than 5 years, the Administrative Ministry/borrowing organization may grant extension upto the 6th year after obtaining orders of their Secretary (in the Central Government)/ Chief Secretary (in the State Government)/ equivalent officer (in respect of other cases) and for the 7th year with the approval of the Minister of the borrowing Ministry/Department and in respect of other organizations with the approval of the Minister of the borrowing Ministry/Department with which they are administratively concerned.
- 3. All other terms and conditions issued vide OM No.6/8/2009-Estt.(Pay-II) dated 17th June 2010, OMs No.2/6/2016-Estt.(Pay-II) dated 17th Feb, 2016 and 23rd Feb, 2017 will remain unchanged.
- 4. These orders shall come into effect from the date of issue of this OM.
- 5. In so far as persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department are concerned, these orders issue after consultation with Comptroller and Auditor General of India.

SOTHERCATION

G.S.R. 438(E)...-In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 read with clause (5) of article 148 of the Constitution and after consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor- General of India in relation to persons serving in the Indian Audit and Accounts Department, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Central Civil Services (Leave) Rules, 1972, namely:

- .1. (1) These rules may be called the Gentral Civil Services (Leave) Second Amendment Rules, 2018.
 - (2) They shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th day of April, 2017.
- 2. In the Central Civil Services (Leave) Rules, 1972 (hereinafter referred to as the said rules), in rule 3, in sub-rule (1).-
 - (i) after clause (f), the following clause shall be inserted, namely-
 - (fa) "disability" means "specified disability", "benchmark disability" and "disability having high support needs" as referred to in the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act. 2016(49 of 2016):
- 3. In the said rules, in rule 7, after sub-rule (2), the following proviso shall be inserted, namely:
 - "Provided that leave applied under rule 20, shall not be refused or revoked without reference to the Medical Authority, whose advice shall be binding.".
- 4. In the said rules, in rule 12,-
- (a) in sub-rule (1), after the words "No Government", the word "servant" shall be inserted; (b) after sub-rule (2), the following proviso shall be inserted namely:-
- "Provided that this rule shall not apply to a ease where leave is applied on medical certificate, in connection
- 5. In the said rules, in rule 14, the following proviso shall be inserted, namely:-
 - " Provided that where a Government servant is unable to submit an application or medical certificate on account of a disability, such application or medical certificate may be signed and submitted by -
 - (a) the spouse of the Government servant, or
 - (b) the parents in case of an unmarried Government servant; or
 - (c) the child including adopted child orbrother or sister of the Government servant, who has attained the age of
 - (d) any person who has been assigned limited guardianship of the Government servant in terms of section 14 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016(49 of 2016).

and the same shall be deemed to have been made and submitted by the Government servant himself.".

- 6. In the said rules, in rule 19, for sub-rule 2, the following shall be substituted, namely:-
 - "(2) In case of a Government servant who has acquired a disability, the Medical Authority shall certify, in Form
 - (a) the nature and extent of the disability;
 - (b) the date from which such disability has occurred or manifested, to the extent it may be medically possible to indicate the same;
 - (c) whether there are reasonable prospects for the Government servant to be fit to resume duties, and if not, categorically state that such Government servant is completely and permanently incapacitated for
 - (2A) For the purposes of these rules, a doctor in Central Government Health Scheme or a Government Hospital. or a specialist in Government Hospital in cases requiring specialised treatment, or a Medical Board in a Government Hospital in the case of multiple disabilities shall, in addition to the authority certifying specified disability under the provisions contained in Chapter X of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016(49 of 2016), be the Medical Authorities competent to issue certificate of disability in Form 3A.
 - (2B) Notwithstanding anything in these rules, no reference from the Head of Office or any other authority may be required for issue of medical certificate of disability.".
- 7. In the said rules, in rule 20,-
 - (a) in sub-rule (1), in clause (b), for sub-clauses (i) and (ii), the following shall be substituted, namely:-
 - "(i) if the Medical Authority is unable to say with certainty that the Government servant, who has acquired a disability, will never again be fit for service, leave not exceeding twelve months at a time may be granted and such leave shall not be extended without further reference to a Medical Authority;
 - (ii) if a Government servant is declared by the Medical Authority, as specified in rule 19, as to have acquired such disability which may prevent him from discharging further service, leave or an extension of leave may be granted to him after the certificate of the Medical Authority has been received in Form 3A:

Provided that any leave debited for the period(s) granted under sub-clause (i) of clause (b), after receipt of the certificate of disability of the Medical Authority, shall be remitted back into the leave account of the Government servant:

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Provided further that any leave granted to regulate the period of absence under sub-clause (ii) of clause (b), after receipt of the certificate of the Medical Authority, shall not be debited to the leave account of the Government servant."

- (b) for sub-rule (2), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:-
- "(2) in the case of a Government servant who is granted leave in accordance with the provisions of clause (b) of sub-rule (1), the provisions of section 20 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) shall, suo motu, apply."
- 8. In the said rules, after Form 3, the following Form shall be inserted, namely:-

Keeping in view the spirit and underlying intent of the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, the provisions of the Central Civil Service (Leave) Rules, 1972 are being synchronised with the aforesaid statutory provision by incorporating required amendments in the Central Civil Services (Leave) Rules, 1972.

It is certified that by giving retrospective effect to these rules, the interest of no person is likely to be adversely affected.

Notification of empanelment of Private Hospitals and Diagnostic Centres under continuous empnelment scheme of CGHS, Meerut

As per Ministry letter No.F.No.S-11045/36/2012-CGHS(HEC), dated 16-10-2015 and further subsequent revised guidelines for NABH/NABL/QCI HCO's allowing benefit of continuous empanelment scheme. The application received till 28-3-2018(Last working day of March, 2018) for continuous empanelment

of Private Hospitals and Diagnostic Centres under CGHS, Meerut, a committee was formed with three CMOs headed by undersigned including Office Superintendent. Inspection for authentication of documents submitted was carried out by committee members, Vigilance Officer, CGHS, Meerut and Office Superintendent, CGHS, Meerut. - 2. The empanelment shall be for a period of two months till 30-6-2018 from the date of notification or till next empanelment process, whichever is earlier.

Clarification regarding issue of medicines prescribed by Specialists beyond the period for which the medicines had been advised

With reference to the above subject, the undersigned is directed to state that this Ministry is in receipt of representations from CGHS beneficiaries, particularly from Senior Citizens regarding refusal of CGHS for issue of medicines prescribed by Specialists, immediately on expiry of the period for which the prescription has been issued. The matter has been reviewed by the Competent Authority in view of the difficulties faced by the CGHS beneficiaries and it is now decided that Medical Officers of CGHS can issue the same medicines to CGHS beneficiaries prescribed by the Specialists even after the expiry of the validity of the prescription in

Chronic diseases, where the clinical condition is stable and CGHS shall not insist on immediate revalidation by Specialists.

However, in cases of Chemotherapy and immunosuppressant treatment regular follow-up from Specialists would be advisable.

These guidelines are in supersession of the guidelines issued earlier on the subject.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Eligibility of Permanently Disabled Unmarried Son of a CGHS Beneficiary to avail CGHS facility - Reg.

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Ministry's Office Memoranda of even number dated 31.05.2007, 29.08.2007 and 02.08.2010 vide which the entitlement of the son of a CGHS beneficiary beyond the age of 25 years was conveyed. As per the two Office Memoranda under reference, it was indicated that an unmarried son of a CGHS beneficiary suffering from any permanent disability of any kind (physical or mental) will be entitled to CGHS facility even after attaining the age of 25 years.

2. Since then this Ministry is in receipt of several representations for inclusion of more conditions in view of modification to the PwD Act, 1995 by "The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (Act No. 49 of 2016)" as notified by M/o Law and Justice, Govt. of India on 27.12.2016. The matter has been reviewed by the Ministry and it is now decided that for the purpose of extending the CGHS benefits to dependent unmarried son of CGHS beneficiary beyond 25 years of age, the definition of 'Permanent Disability' shall include the following conditions:

I. Physical disability:

A. Locomotor disability including

a) Leprosy cured person- suffering from loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity or suffering from manifest deformity and paresis or having extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from gainful occupation

b) Cerebral palsy – caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain usually occurring before, during or immediately after birth.

- c) Dwarfism- a medical genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 147 cms or less;
- d) Muscular dystrophy- a group of hereditary genetic muscle diseases characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness
- e) Acid attack victims disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing acid or similar corrosive substance

B. Visual impairment:

a) Blindness- where a person has any of the following conditions after best correction:

(i) Total absence of sight or

- Visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200(Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction
- (iii) Limitation of field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree

b) "Low vision" means any of the following conditions:

(i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 up to 3/60 up to 10/200

(Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or

(ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree

C. Hearing Impairment

- (a) "deaf" means persons having 70 db hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- (b) "hard of hearing" means persons having 60 db to 70 db hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- D. "Speech and Language disability" permanent disability arising out of conditions such as Laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neuronal causes.
- II. Intellectual disability- characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behavior, which cover a range of every day, social and practical skills, including-
 - (a) "Specific language disabilities" a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do the mathematical calculations and includes conditions such as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia
 - (b) "Autism spectrum disorder" a neuro-developmental disorder typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviour.

III. Mental behaviour

"Mental illness"- a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgement, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation.

IV. Mental Retardation

- V. Disability caused due to
 - (a) Chronic neurological conditions such as
 - (i) Multiple Sclerosis
 - (ii) Parkinson's disease
 - (b) Blood disorder
 - (i) Haemophila
 - (ii) Thalassemia
 - (iii) Sickle Cell Disease
- VI. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above disabilities)- including deaf blindness
- 3. Bench Mark Disability- unmarried permanently disabled and financially dependent sons of CGHS beneficiaries suffering 40% or more of one or more disabilities as certified by a Medical Board shall be eligible to avail CGHS facilities even after attaining the age of 25 years.
- 4. This OM will be effective from the date of its issue.

Subject :- Prescription of Timelines under CGHS for settlement of Medical claims of Pensioner CGHS beneficiaries

With reference to the above subject the undersigned is directed to draw attention to the OM No Z 15025/79/1/DIR/CGHS dated the 5th October 2016 and to state that it has now been decided to review the timelines prescribed for processing and settlement of medical claims of pensioner CGHS beneficiaries in compliance of the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in their Judgement in the WP(Civil) No 694 of 2015 between Shiva Kant Jha Vs UOI delivered on 13th April 2018 and in supersession of the earlier guidelines as per the details given under:

Medical Claims not requiring Special approvals

Pensioner CGHS beneficiaries shall submit the Medical claims to the CMO I/C of the CGHS Wellness Centre, where the CGHS Card is enrolled. CMO I/C of CGHS Wellness Centre issues Serial Number and sends the claim papers to the office of the Addl. Director, CGHS for processing. The Bills shall be processed by the Dealing Asstants and CMO and after the approval by the Additional Director, the bill for payment shall be sent to the Pay & Accounts Office for payment to the beneficiary by ECS. The payment shall be completed within 30 days of submission of the Medical claim papers at the CGHS Wellness Centre.

- 2. Chief Medical Officer in charge shall thoroughly check the papers initially for the completeness of the requisite documents before accepting the claim papers to ensure that the claim papers are not returned subsequently for want of some documents.
- 3. If approval of Directorate or Ministry is involved, the Addl. Directors shall submit only e-file with self-contained note and recommendation, enclosing only relevant scanned documents. Care shall be taken not to regret medical claims of pensioner CGHS beneficiaries on minor technical objections if , they fall under procedural lapses, which can be condoned.

Subject: Reiteration of instructions relating to reservation in temporary appointments - regarding

The undersigned is directed to say that as per the extant guidelines issued vide Office Memorandum No. 27/4/67(II)-Estt.(SCT) dated 24.09.1968, reservations are to be made for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in all temporary appointments, except appointments which are to last for less than 45 days.

- 2. It has been brought to the notice of this Department by the Hon'ble National Commission for Scheduled Tribes that the Office Memorandum dated 24.09.1968 is old and the instructions laid down in the OM must be reiterated. It is, therefore, reiterated that, in respect of appointments to Central Government posts and services there shall be reservation for Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe/ Other Backward Class candidates in temporary appointments which are to last for 45 days or more
- 3. All Ministries/ Departments/ Organizations are requested to please bring the contents of this O.M. to the notice of all concerned for information and compliance.

Subject: LTC facilities to the Civilian employees of the Central Government serving in States of the North-Eastern Region, Ladakh region of State of Jammu & Kashmir and in Union Territories of Andaman & Nicobar Island and Lakshadweep Group of Islands – Implementation of recommendations of 7th CPC.

The undersigned is directed to refer to Department of Expenditure's O.M. No. 11(2)/97-E.II(B) dated 22nd July, 1998, regarding Allowance & Special Facilities for civilian employees of the Central Government serving in States and Union Territories of the North-Eastern Region and in the Andaman & Nicobar Island and Lakshadweep Group of Islands.

- The aforesaid O.M. provided the option of availing every year Home Town LTC (for self and family) to a Government servant serving in North-Eastern Region, Andaman & Nicobar and Lakshadweep groups of Islands who leaves his family behind at the old headquarters or another selected place of residence, and who has not availed of transfer travelling allowance for family. In addition, two additional passages under "Emergency Passage Concession" is also provided to the employees posted in these regions to enable them and/or their families [spouse and two dependent children] to travel either to the Home Town or the station of posting in an emergency.
- 3. The Seventh Pay Commission has recommended that splitting of hometown LTC should be allowed in case of employees posted in North East, Ladakh and Island territories of Andaman, Nicobar and Lakshadweep. This will enable these employees and their families to meet more often.
- 4. Consequent upon acceptance of recommendations of Seventh Pay Commission, it has been decided that a civilian Central Government servant serving in North-Eastern Region, Ladakh region of State of Jammu & Kashmir, Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep groups of Islands, who leaves his family behind at the old headquarters or another selected place of residence and has not availed of transfer travelling allowance for family, shall be provided with the following options for the purpose of LTC:
 - (i) The Government servant may avail LTC for journey to the Home Town once in a block period of two years and/or one 'Anywhere in India' LTC in a block of four years under the normal LTC rules.

From pre-page:

- (ii) In lieu thereof, the Government servant may avail the facility for himself/herself to travel once a year from the station of posting to the Home Town or the place where the family is residing and for the family [restricted only to the spouse and dependent children as per the 'family' definition of CCS(LTC), Rules, 1988] to travel once a year to visit the Government servant at the station of posting.
- 5. In addition, Central Government employees and their families posted in these territories shall be entitled to avail of the Leave Travel Concession, in emergencies, on two additional occasions during their entire service career. This shall be termed as "Emergency Passage Concession" and is intended to enable the Central Government employees and/or their families [restricted only to spouse and dependent children] to travel either to the Home Town or the station of posting in an emergency. The two additional passages under the Emergency Passage Concession shall be availed by the entitled mode and class of travel as admissible under the normal Leave Travel Concession Rules.
- 6 This O.M. will take effect from July 1, 2017.

Subject: Admissibility of air fare for children below the age of 5 years of the Government servants non-entitled to travel by air on LTC – clarification reg.

The undersigned is directed to invite reference to Department of Personnel & Training's O.M. No. 31011/2/2006-Estt.A dated 24.4.2006, 21.05.2007 and 03.12.2007 which stipulates that a non-entitled Government servant is allowed to travel by air while availing LTC provided that the reimbursement made in such cases is restricted to the train fare of entitled class. In this regard, it may be noted that while no fare is charged by Railways for a child below the age of 5 years travelling by train, airlines charge full air fare for child of 2 years of age and above.

- 2. This Department is in receipt of references from various Ministries/Departments seeking clarification on reimbursement of LTC claim in a situation where a child of a non-entitled Government servant, aged less than 5 years, travels by air on LTC and entitled train fare is claimed by that Government employee in respect of his/her child.
- 3. The matter has been examined and it is clarified that since children below the age of 5 years are not charged for rail journeys, no reimbursement shall be made in respect of the air journey performed by children, aged less than 5 years, of the Government servants who are not entitled to travel by air on LTC. It may be noted that this provision shall not be applicable for the segments where the air journey has been allowed to the non-entitled Government servants and their families under the special dispensation scheme, existent from time to time.

The undersigned is directed to refer to the aforementioned subject and to state that, in further partial modification of this Department's O.M. of even no. dated 16.08.2016, as amended on 20.02.2017, 14.03.2017, 05.05.2017, 17.07.2017 and 14.03.2018, the time limits for receipt and disposal of anomalies relating to the Seventh Central Pay Commission are further extended as under:

- (i) time limit for receipt of anomalies is extended from 15.08.2017 to 15.05.2018; and
- (ii) time limit for disposal of anomalies is extended from 15.02.2018 to 15.11.2018.
